# Academic Programs

## Regular Education Programs

All students receive core instruction in language arts, math, science, social studies, fine arts, foreign language (7-8), physical education and health, and social emotional learning. Teachers are always learning and applying new instructional strategies to meet the needs of students in the regular setting.

## Enrichment Programs

Students explore and expand knowledge in SEEK. The SEEK program is designed to meet the needs of individual students, extend student learning in the content areas, and foster the development of higher level thinking strategies.

## Response to Intervention

Reading and math specialists work in an RtI model. RtI is a problem solving approach that greatly expands the capacity of schools to accommodate diverse learners and help students very quickly who are falling behind their peers in reading, math and even appropriate behaviors.

## English Language Learners (ELL)

The District's ELL program and Russian and Korean Transitional Bilingual Education (TBE) programs promote equitable access to language support services for students from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds who have been identified as English Language Learners.

## Special Education Programs

Students with special needs, including learning, social and/or emotional disabilities, may receive services in speech/language, occupational and physical therapies, psychological services and adaptive physical education. District 102 provides early childhood and at-risk prekindergarten programs.

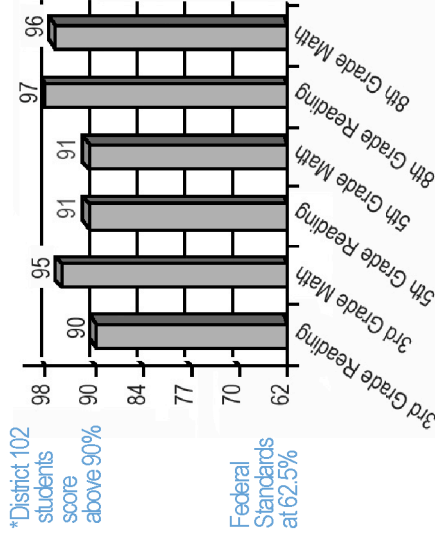
## Extracurricular Activities

Aptakisic Junior High School offers an extensive array of extracurricular activities, afterschool clubs, intramural, and interscholastic sports teams. Meridian Middle School offers diverse after school activities, followed by Club Meridian, a supervised afterschool program that runs until 6 p.m. each night. The Buffalo Park District offers before and afterschool activities at Pritchett and Tripp Elementary Schools.

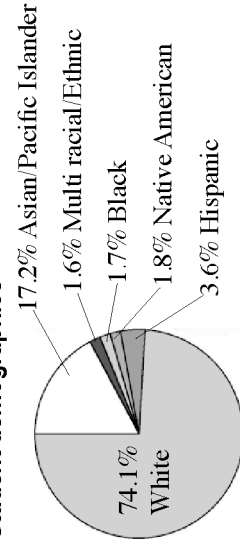
# Statistics

## 2008 Student Achievement

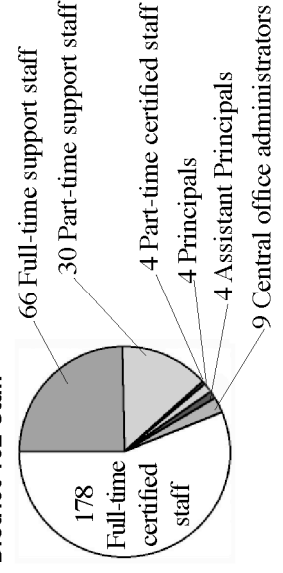

## Student demographics



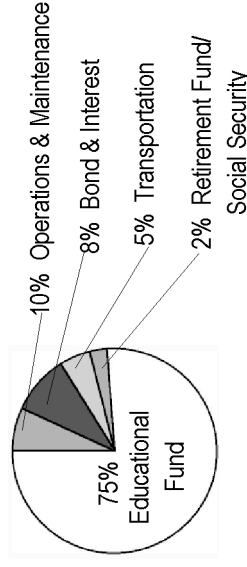
